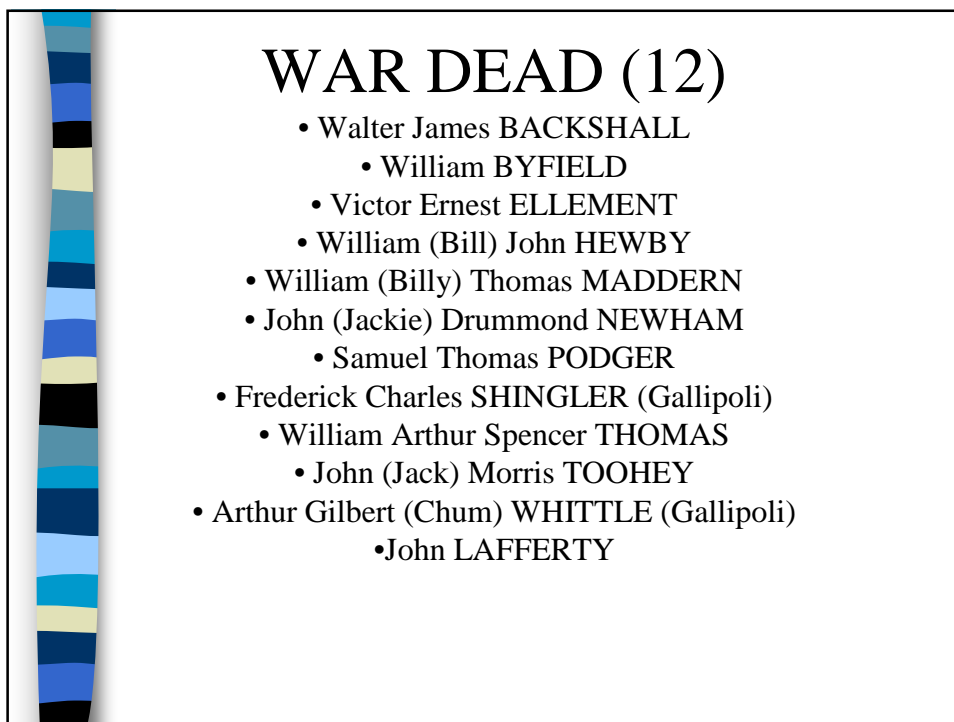
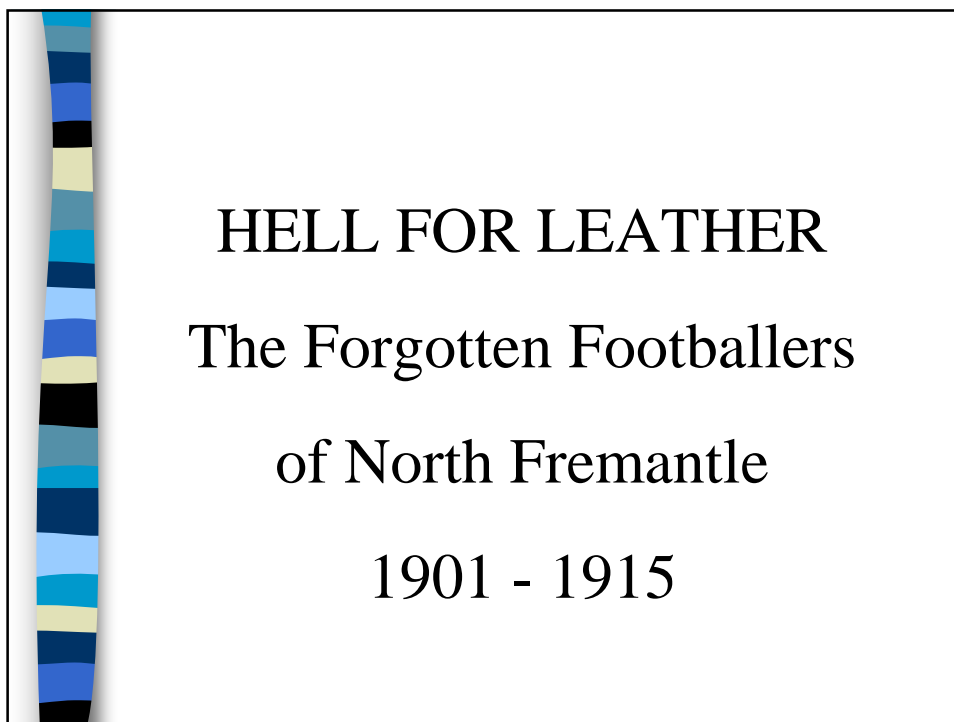

BOVELL, Henry Thomas – **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

BROWNE, Daniel Francis – 19 games **HOSPITALISED**

BROWNE, Michael Joseph James – 42 games. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

CALLAGHAN, John J. - played eight games. **DEBILITATED**

CAMPBELL, George William – played just one game in 1915 **PRISONER OF WAR**

CAMPBELL, Hugh – played 12 games in 1915.

CAMPBELL, J.B. (Jack) – played four games in 1914.

CAMPBELL, John Stewart – Played 29 games 1914, 1915. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

CHARLTON Leslie Richard – played 115 1905-15. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

CLANCY, James Michael – played 11 games in two seasons 1910-11.

CORKHILL, Maurice – played 16 games. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

DOUST, Alfred Edward – played eight games.

EVANS, Howard Lindon (M.M.) – played four games in 1911 at 18 years of age.

GURNEY, Webster Sylvester – played five games in 1915. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

HOFT, Cyril Louis – played 11 games in 1914. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

IVES, Arthur James – played 42 games (1913-15). **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

JONES, Ernest Joseph Giffen – played six games in 1915. **DEBILITATED**

KENNINGTON, Harry – played 61 games from 1905-11. **DEBILITATED**

KENWORTHY, Charles – played 39 games 1907-09. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

KJELLGREN, Ernest Frederick Charles – played six games in 1914.

LOWE, Roy Charles – played 67 games between 1911-15. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

MEHARRY, George Hugh – played 79 games in six seasons. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

MEHARRY, Samuel Fellows – played 13 games in 1910.

ORR, William Richard (Billy) – played 32 games 1904-05. **WOUNDED IN ACTION**

SANDILANDS, John Graham – played one game in 1913.

SPENCE, Allan – played two games in 1915. **DEBILITATED**

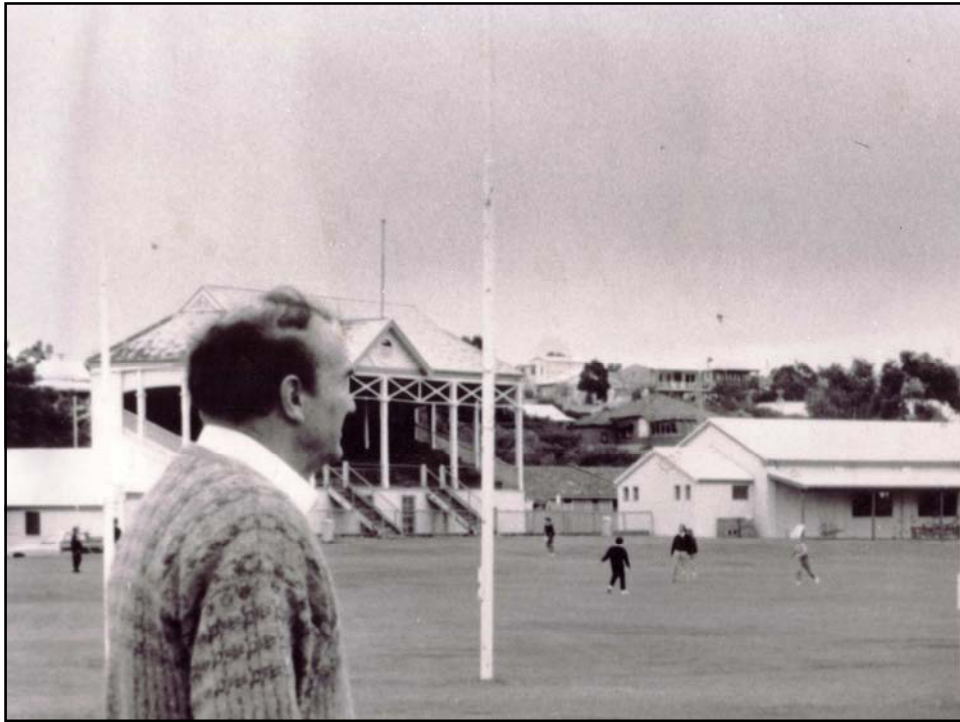
SPENCE, Walter James – played 10 games in 1914-15. **DEBILITATED**

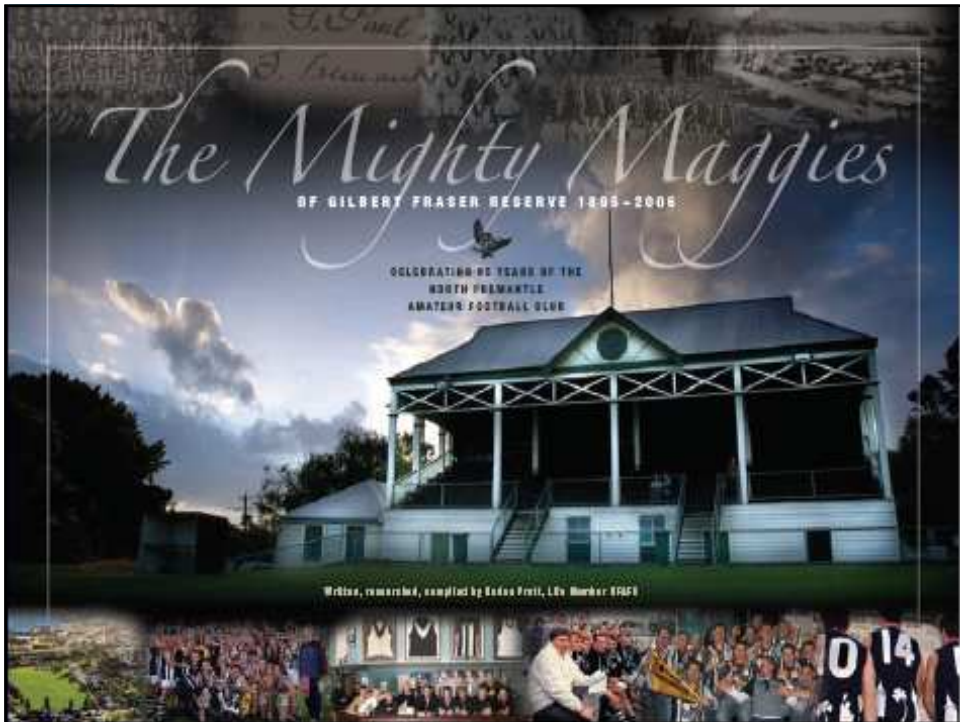

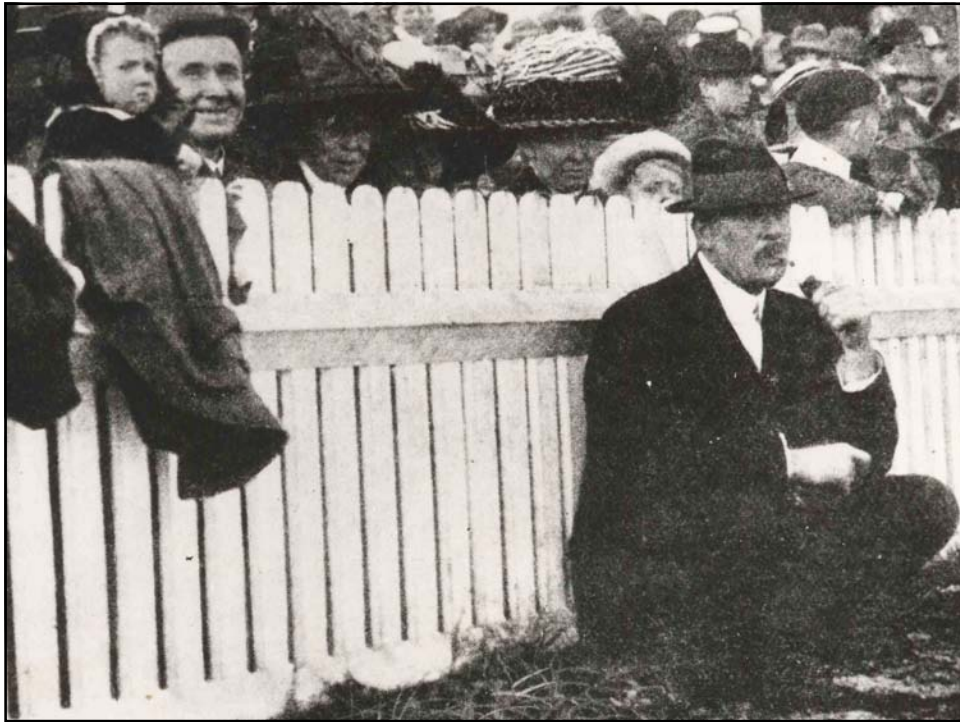
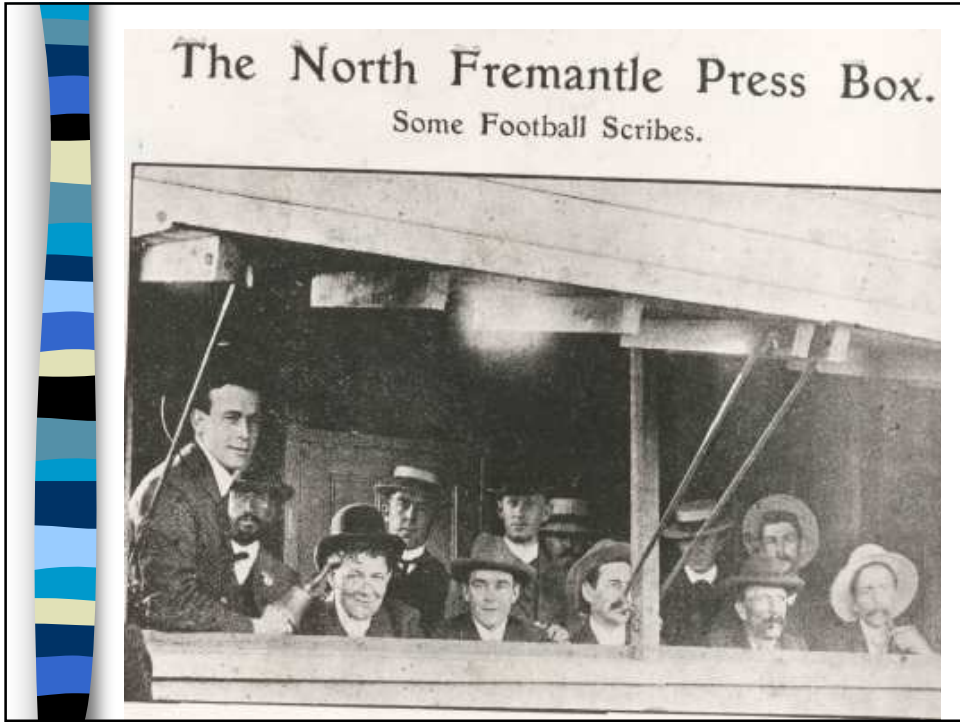
