SilverSport Provider Registration Form

SilverSport allows eligible seniors to apply for up to \$200 towards sport and active recreation fees.

SilverSport is available from 1 April 2017 through the following participating local governments:

1. City of Albany
2. City of Bunbury

Seniors need to be 60 years or over and hold a valid Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card to be eligible for SilverSport.

SilverSport is available until funding runs out.

How does it work?

- 1 Eligible seniors submit a SilverSport application form to the local government they reside in.
- 2 The local government assesses the application and advises applicant of the outcome within 10 working days.
- 3 The applicant receives a copy of the approved form to give to their chosen SilverSport provider.
- 4 The SilverSport provider invoices the local government for the cost of the applicant's fees (up to \$200).

What are SilverSport providers?

Clubs, community organisations, businesses and recreation centres delivering sport and active recreation can apply to become a registered SilverSport provider through the participating local government authority.

Why become a SilverSport provider?

- Engage new and diverse people in your organisation.
- Increase your membership and client base.
- Free promotion through local governments.
- Build a relationship with your local government and your community.
- Opportunities to engage new volunteers and support.

SilverSport Provider eligibility criteria

To register as a SilverSport provider you must meet the following criteria:

Important information

- If you do not have an ABN you will need to complete a 'Statement by Supplier not Quoting an ABN Form' and attach this to your registration. Forms are available at www.ato.gov.au/forms
- SilverSport providers must register with the relevant participating local government and provide information as requested.
- SilverSport providers must be based and operate in Western Australia.
- SilverSport providers cannot deliver services as part of the SilverSport program unless they have been approved by a participating local government.
- It is the responsibility of the SilverSport provider to ensure that all coaches and instructors delivering sport and active recreation are adequately qualified.
- The Department of Sport and Recreation encourages all sport and active recreation clubs to be affiliated with their State or Regional Sporting Association.
- It is strongly recommended that you are incorporated. More information is available at www.commerce.wa.gov.au

SilverSport Provider registration process

- 1 If you want to be involved in the SilverSport program as a registered SilverSport provider please complete this registration form and submit it to the relevant local government/s.
- 2 The local government will advise if you have been approved.
- 3 If approved, all registered SilverSport providers will be promoted through the local government.
